**Workshop II: Chair Samia Joca, associated professor Aarhus University Developing an international concept-based curriculum for pharmacology education**

Rationale and background: Pharmacology forms a critical bridge between basic biomedical sciences and clinical reasoning. Yet, both students and educators face increasing pressure to modernize how pharmacology is taught and assessed. Traditional approaches are limited in preparing students for the complexity of evidence-based prescribing, translational research, and personalized medicine.

This symposium will gather educators from Danish universities to discuss how pharmacology teaching can evolve to meet the needs of modern health and life science education. We will explore innovative didactic strategies, integration across preclinical and clinical curricula, and the role of digital learning tools. The session will also open a national dialogue on how to define and assess pharmacological competence - a question of particular importance as medical and biomedical programs are restructured under the new Danish higher-education reforms.
